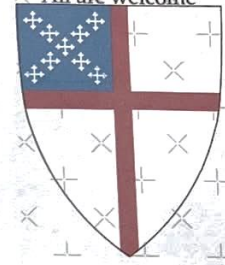

# THE REVEREND'S CORNER



Saints,

It's been nice to move back into the sanctuary. We have a beautiful space to worship in and it holds a lot of sentimental value to the parish. More on worship....in trying to adhere to our Anglican-Episcopal roots you'll notice some subtle changes in our anthems (not to be confused with hymns or hers 😊). In Advent we will follow the tradition of switching to Eucharistic Prayer B. In Lent we follow tradition and use Eucharistic prayer C as well as using the beautiful and poetic language of Rite I.

I miss the Book of Common Prayer and the breadth and richness it gives us. There is something about holding the BCP that is special. The BCP was the first written book of worship that was written in the vernacular, that is in the native tongue of the country. Thomas Cranmer had the book published in 1549 and it is common in that everyone understood English and could say the prayers together (as opposed to Latin). I'm looking forward to expanding our worship to include more of its material.

Pray for the success of the basket raffle and for the tired, lonely, sick and the poor.

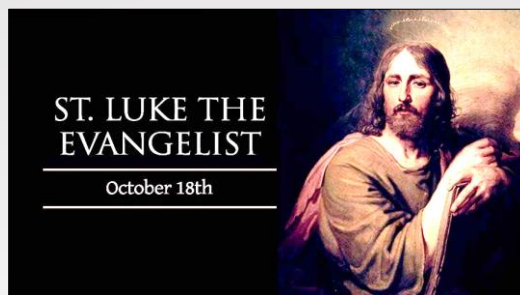

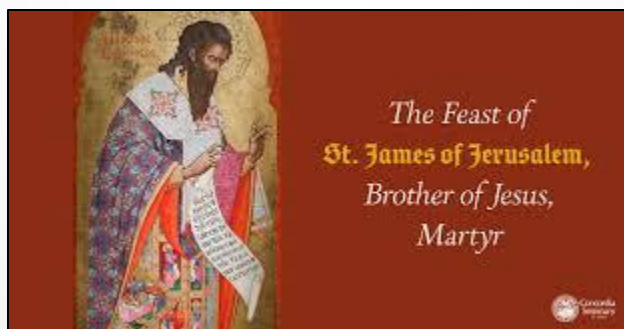

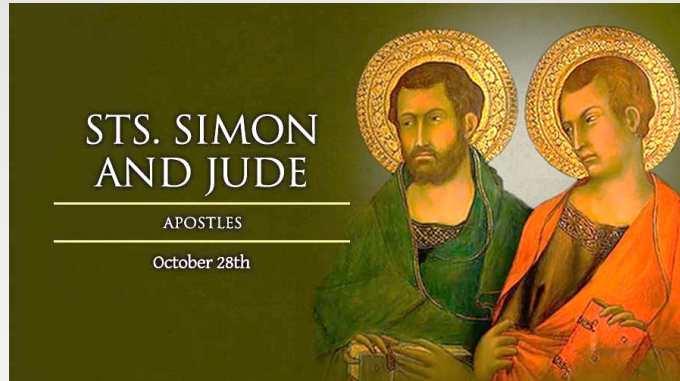

## Parishioner Peter Stidham made The Times News!

### Military service a tradition for Lehighton veteran

When Peter Stidham looks back on his decades of service, he sees a lifetime that touched nearly every corner of the globe, carried on a proud family tradition and built bonds that still shape his life today.

Stidham, who grew up in Hyden, Kentucky, before moving to Pennsylvania and graduating from Pocono Mountain High School, served in the Navy, Army National Guard and Air Force Reserve. His military journey began in 1969.

"I was in the United States Navy from 1969 to 1973," Stidham said. "I served a tour of duty in Vietnam in '72. Then in 1981 I went into the Army National Guard, which was all



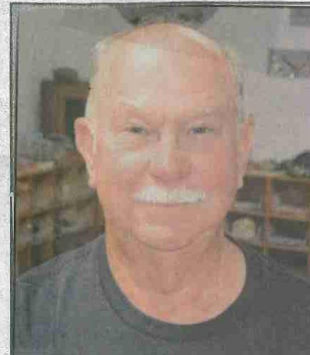
reserve at the time, and stayed until 1985. In 1989 I went into the Air Force Reserve and was activated for Desert Shield/Desert Storm."

In the Navy, Stidham worked on machinery and engines. Later, in the National Guard, he was a radio repairman. While serving, he used the GI Bill to pursue an engineering degree at the University of Scranton.

"I was already working on radios as a civilian at The Tobyhanna Army Depot," Stidham said. "So when I got into the National Guard, it kind of fit right in. I was already trained."

When he joined the Air Force Reserve, he became a cargo specialist.

"We used to laugh and call ourselves 'box kickers,'" he said. "We loaded and unloaded

ed planes, pushed pallets onto the aircraft and pulled them off when they came back."

Stidham stayed with the 92nd Aerial Port Squadron until it was decommissioned in 2007.

"I retired from there in '07 as a chief master sergeant and from my civilian job with the Tobyhanna Army Depot in '08," he said.

Enlisting in the Navy meant Stidham would keep his word that he wouldn't be drafted.

"I swore I'd never get drafted, so I enlisted," Stidham said. "I picked the Navy because my uncle had been in the Navy. He told me, 'Pete, you go to all these different places, you get to travel.' He was right."

His Navy training began at Great Lakes, Illinois.

"I also went to Engineman A school there," Stidham said.

For the Air Force, he trained at Dobbins Air Reserve Base in Georgia.

"That's where you learned to drive forklifts, K loaders, and how to load planes," he added.

His time in the Navy brought him to the Military Ocean Terminal at Bayonne, New Jersey, where he served aboard an ammunition ship.

"When we woke up, you could see the Statue of Liberty," Stidham

said. "They told us that if we ever blew up, we'd take half of New York City with us."

In January 1971, he transferred to a destroyer stationed in Newport, Rhode Island. That ship would take him to Vietnam and eventually on a journey around the world.

"It was actually a trip all the way around the world," he said. "We left Newport, went through the Panama Canal, stopped in Hawaii, Guam and Subic Bay in the Philippines. After Vietnam we went to Singapore, Pakistan, then down the coast of Africa — Kenya, Mozambique — and back to Newport."

Stidham also recalled a Mediterranean cruise that brought him to Italy, Spain, Turkey, Greece and Malta. His Air Force Reserve service took him to Elmendorf Air Force Base in Alaska, Mildenhall Air Base in England, Ramstein Air Base in Germany and the Azores.

One mission stands out most vividly in his memory.

"We were sent above Haiphong Harbor in North Vietnam. Our mission was to get as close to shore as we could to draw fire," Stidham said. "That was probably the hairiest one. Another ship was supposed to track where the fire was coming from. We also had times where we got gunfire requests and joined in offensives with the 5-inch guns on the ship."

Not all of his memories were

tense.

"As far as enjoyment, Ramstein, Germany, because my mother was from Germany," Stidham said. "I just enjoyed the food, the beer, and the atmosphere."

He said he felt pride throughout his service.

"I was proud to serve my country," he said. "My father was in World War II. My grandfather was in World War I. We have a family tradition of service, and my father was very proud of me."

Returning to civilian life wasn't a major adjustment, Stidham said, since he had worked as a diesel mechanic in between service commitments.

But the habits of military life stayed with him.

"You're never going to get rid of the military," he said. "I call people yes, ma'am, yes, sir, respectful. Your mindset is military. I've got a job to do, I'm going to do it."

Even today, small details stick. "From boot camp, I used to fold my shirts a certain way," he said. "I still do it that way."

Stidham remains active in veterans organizations, including the Lehighton American Legion, Nesquehoning VFW and the Vietnam Veterans of Carbon County.

"There's nothing better than getting with a bunch of vets," he said. "They know what you went through, and you hear what they went through. It's a brotherhood."

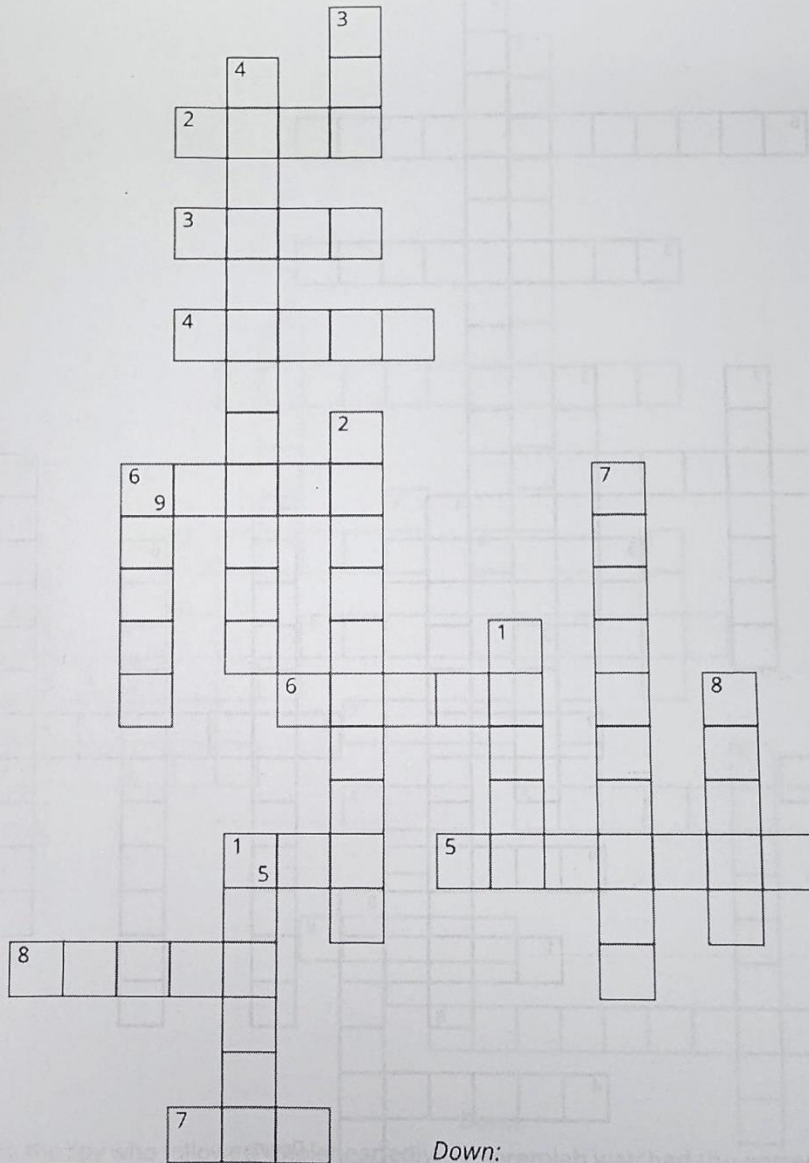

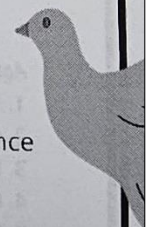

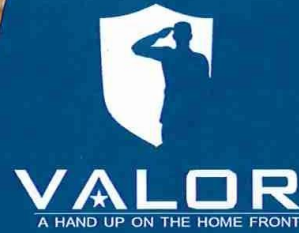

Dear Christian Friends

We are writing to you with a heavy heart. After years of serving our Community as Life (Lehighton Interfaith Fellowship) we have decided to dissolve our mission to serve the Lehighton Weissport Community of Faith.

Life held its first meeting in 1988. First By-laws - July 25, 1991.

Areas of Concern were as follows:

Dial a Devotions: This mission was started by the Lehighton Weissport Council of Churches in the 1960's. This mission was to put on a spiritual telephone message daily. Rev. H. Wilson Scott, pastor at the First Presbyterian Church, Lehighton, was the coordinator and felt that Life could continue this mission. Life did take this on and Pastor Scott continued to coordinate this mission. Local pastors and lay people were assigned a day in the week Monday through Friday. The phone line had been set up at Zion United Church of Christ and continued till Life disconnected the service on April 20, 2024.

The Life Furniture Bank was set up to help people in need of furniture. CAPPAC in Palmerton was getting calls from the Lehighton area and approached Life to take this mission on. Sandra and Richard Ebert accept this challenge. Finding a storage area and helpers was a challenge. After being in a local garage we finally found a storage area "A Place for You Stuff" now "Load and Lock" and were in that storage area till 2023. We are grateful for the men who would pick up donations and deliver them. Many families were helped over the years and we appreciated the furniture donations.

Baccalaureate Services for the Lehighton Area High School. Life began to coordinate the service in 1993. Rev. H. Wilson Scott and the Life Worship Committee coordinated the service along with the Senior Class Officers and their advisor. The services have been held at Zion United Church of Christ. In 2022 because of COVID the service was held Virtual and in 2023 it was held at the Lehighton Park Amphitheater. In 2024 and 2025 it was again held at Zion UCC. Invitations to the class member's families and the bulletins are printed by Zion UCC. The Rev. Anthony Pagotto coordinated the service in 2025 with the class officers and the class advisor.

The Lehighton CROP Walk mission was to raise funds for Church World Services and a local Food Pantry. The Trinity Pantry was chosen. The first walk was held in 1992. The walkers started at the Lehighton Park Amphitheater and proceeded through the streets of the borough ending at Zion United Church of Christ for refreshments. The walk was later moved to the Lehigh Canal Park in Weissport. In 2022 no walk was held but donations were accepted. Moving forward. In 2023 and 2024 the CROP Walk was coordinated by Dinkey Memorial Lutheran Church and St. John's Lutheran Church, Mahoning. The walk was held at the Riverwalk Park, West Bowmans, Lehighton. This year it will be held October 12, 2025 at the Riverwalk Park, West Bowmans, Lehighton.

The World Day of Prayer Service: This service is written by the Christian Women from around the world usually held on the first Friday in March. Different churches would host the service with a time for fellowship and refreshments afterwards. The last service was held in March 2022 at The First Presbyterian Church.

Big Brothers Big Sisters: Ray Koons came to a meeting and suggested there was a need here in Carbon County. A community meeting was held and a chapter was formed. Mayor Wilbur Bauchspies helped to locate office space and a caseworker, Barbara Foster was hired. A grant from Carbon County Children and Youth was received. To raise funds a Bowl a Thon was held. The first one was held at Fritz's Lanes & Pro Shop and Cypress Lanes, Lehighton and Haja Lanes, Palmerton. Later just Fritz's Lane & Pro Shop, Lehighton. For more Information on Big Brothers Big Sisters contact the Carbon Monroe County Office at 570-824-8756.

September 11, 2001: A service was held in the Lehighton Park Amphitheater. This service was coordinated by Life and many organizations took part. Life continued holding a Service of Remembrance till 2016.

Pennsylvania House Representative Keith R. McCall had presented a Citation to Life in recognition of holding the service on September 11, 2001.

Life received a Citation from Pennsylvania Senator James J. Rhoades and Representative Keith R. McCall in honor of being chosen by the Lehighton Chamber of Commerce as Volunteer Group of the Year October 21, 1993.

This is a brief description of the mission that Life served our Brothers and Sisters in the Lehighton-Weissport area.

The Life Account after closing the Furniture Bank, the Verizon Account for telephone service for Dial a Devotion and our charges for the 2024 Baccalaureate Service the Balance was \$257.23. A check for \$100.00 was received from Zion United Church of Christ on January 24, 2025 giving a balance of \$357.23. We are given the balance of \$357.23 to Zion United Church of Christ for future Baccalaureate Services.

It has been a wonderful journey for all of us who have served as members of Life over the decades. The memories of our ministry to the Lehighton Weissport community will linger in our hearts for the rest of our lives. Please take comfort in knowing that all the documentation of this ministry will never be discarded as it will hold a place of honor in the archives of Zion United Church of Christ for future generations to view and reflect on the work we have done as the hands and feet of Jesus Christ.

**How it Works**

Case Management is a free service that works with you to provide planning, advocacy, and linkage to the community resources.

The Case Manager motivates and assists families in gaining stability and independence. The goal for the family is to improve the quality of life in the present and for the future generation.

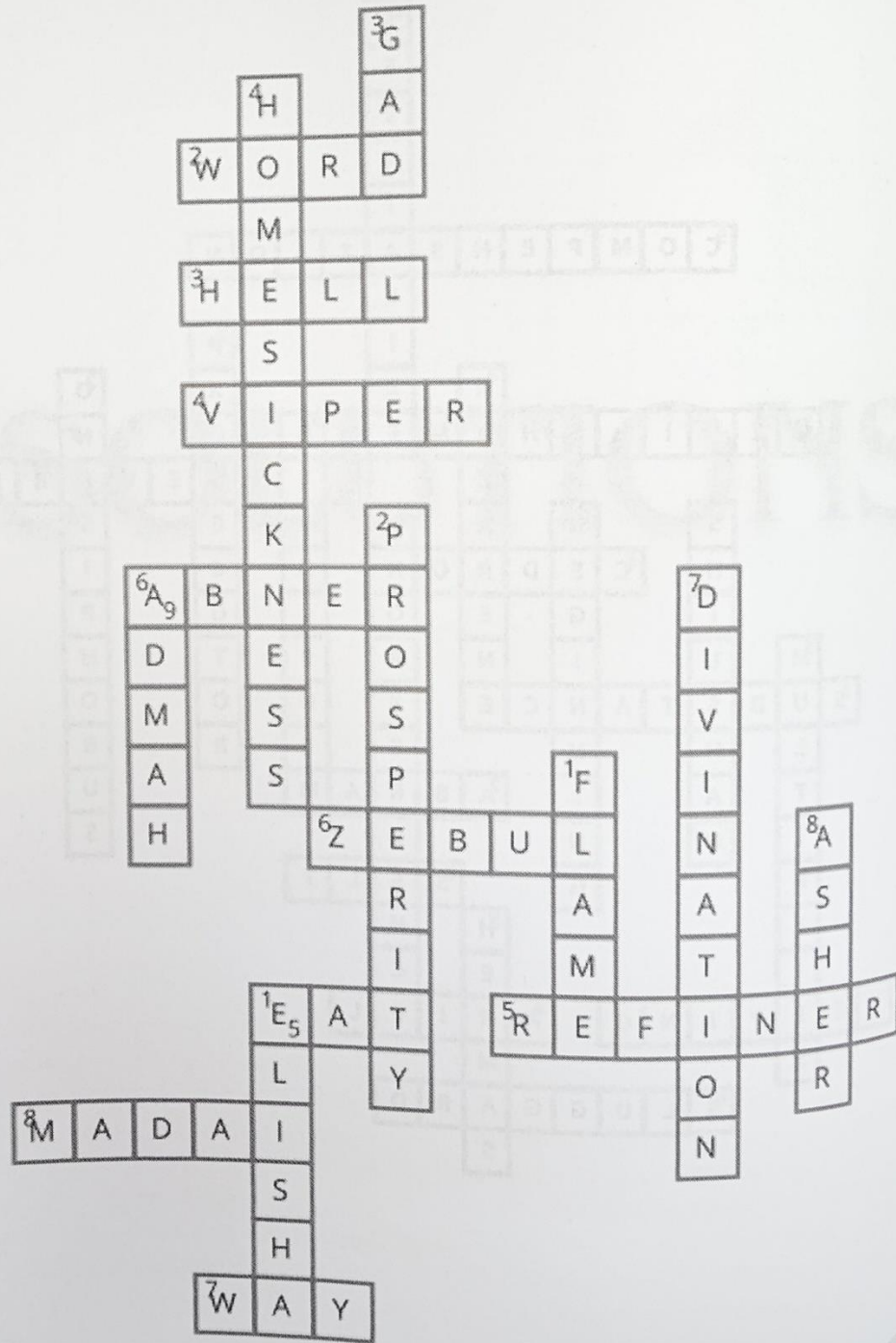
